Individual Exhibitor – Culinary Artistry D1 and D2 conditions of participation

**Inoga – IKA/Culinary Olympics
22 -25 October 2016 in Erfurt**

The German Chefs Association, in the following shortly named as VKD, is the honorary sponsor, the commercial sponsor is the Messe Erfurt GmbH.

Duration and Opening Hours

The Inoga – IKA/Culinary Olympics takes place from Saturday, 22 October 2016 to Wednesday, 25 October 2016 at Fair Erfurt GmbH.

The exhibition is daily open

for participants from 5.00 am to 09.30 pm
for visitors from 10.00 am to 09.00 pm

Opening Ceremony

The national teams are going to be officially introduced during the opening ceremony which will take place on Friday, 21 October 2016, at the Fair Erfurt GmbH, start: 05.00 pm.

Closing Ceremony

The award ceremony and the announcement of the Inoga – IKA / Culinary Olympics winners will take place on Wednesday, 26th October 2016, at the Fair Erfurt GmbH, start: 10.00 am.

Registration

Registration till 31 July 2016

The individual exhibitor will be requested to pay a participation fee of 75 €. The payment of the participation fee can only be done via our Internet site www.olympiade-der-koeche.de via (VISA, MASTERCARD). Transfer costs are at the expense of the remitter.

Registration fees already paid will not be refunded.

The registration fee includes:

- a reserved exhibition place
- 1 long-term ticket, Each escort person amounts 10,- € entrance fee

Competition Requirements

Chefs, pastry chefs, female chefs, female pastry chefs, from all fields, who have successfully completed an apprenticeship or a recognized training.

For each participant (one) 1 complete programme culinary artistry (D1 or D2) must be displayed.

Customs

Generally there should be no problem with the import of goods in limited quantities into Germany.

From overseas the regulations must be respected. Each participant / team receives - upon request - a participation confirmation which has to be shown at customs upon request. Each imported good underlies the health and hygienic food regulations as defined by the EU.

Goods and raw materials

All goods and raw materials required for the preparation of the plates/platters and meals are available at the best quality in Germany. The participants must procure all products by themselves.

Material costs

The raw materials for the elaboration of the exhibition plates as well as decoration are at the expense of the individual exhibitor.

Preparation of the Exhibits

The exhibitor must provide a working place for making the exhibition works himself.

Programme Category D:

While the programmes culinary and pastry art, nutritional and economic factors play the main role, category D is about show and artistry. The exhibits in this category should demonstrate to the visitor the difference between cookery and culinary artistry.

a) Category D/1 – Culinary Artistry

Cold food decorations and showpieces are sculptures made out of margarine, ice, salt, fruit or vegetables cut into decorative shapes and forms, etc.

Height minimum 60 cm and maximum 150 cm including the base

Base maximum 80 cm x 80 cm x 12 cm (height)

Display may extend beyond width and length of the base but cannot exceed the maximum height.

b) Category D/2 – Pastry Artistry

Pastry ornamental sugar work can be icing, pulled or blown sugar into forms and lacework, painting with chocolate, ornamental chocolate work, chocolate cut into decorative shapes and forms, creations made out of nougat and tragacanth, pastillage, gum paste, objects modelled in marzipan, and decorative cakes.

Height minimum 60 cm and maximum 150 cm including the base

Base maximum 80 cm x 80 cm x 12 cm (height)

Display may extend beyond width and length of the base but cannot exceed the maximum height.

Definition for artistic decoration (showpiece/centerpieces):

Any form of decorative and artistic exhibition made from food materials can be considered as a showpiece/centerpiece. Toxic paints and sprays, artificial materials and decorations are not allowed, with the exception of those items designed to lend support to the sculpture. The use of moulds is not allowed.

The most commonly-used materials may include the following: Vegetables, sugar (blown, pulled), ice, chocolate, salt pastillage, tallow, wax, marzipan, butter, shortening fat, cakes, dough, cocoa, paintings spices, almond paste, gum paste, nougat, fruit.

Judgment criteria of category D1 and D2

The exhibition items will only be judged, if they have not already been displayed. Exhibitors should note that an exhibition item displayed in closed show-cases has to be accessible to the jury, as otherwise no judgment will be given. The exhibition item will only be judged if it consists of food materials, but other inner supporting materials may be used.

Category D1 and D2 will be assessed separately.

Design and Composition	30 points
Technical Skills and Degree of difficulty	50 points
Creativity and Originality	20 points

Exhibition Table

The exhibition surface allocated to each individual exhibitor measures

2,10 m x 1,40 m = 2,94 m², it has neutral covering and is mantled with white skirtings.

In the interest of safety in the halls it is forbidden to dismantle the tables or to add one's own tables. A power supply of 220 Volt, 16 A is available under the table. It is strictly forbidden to use living animals as table decorations.

Important: The programme has to be displayed in its entity in one day. Each exhibition item can only once be accepted to the competition.

Labelling

The plates and exhibition items have to be uniformly labelled in order to designate them properly. (names of the exhibition items & of the pastry chef).

The organizer has the right to remove plates that do not fulfil the standard requirements of culinary art.

Judging

The exhibition items must be exhibited at 07.00 am. The withdrawal will start at 6.00 pm.

In case of breach of the above mentioned rules the respective exhibitor will be penalized with a deduction of 5 % of the points obtained in the culinary & pastry art programme by decree of the chairman of the jury.

All exhibition items will be judged individually according to the 100 points system. No half points will be awarded.

Internationale Jury

The international jury consists of officially recognized and approved experts. With the completion of the registration the participant (team) accepts the conditions of participation.

The participant will have a member of the jury at his disposal on a daily basis for a feedback concerning the accomplished programmes.

The decisions of the jury are final and irrevocable.

Awards Ceremony

The awarding of medals and certificates takes place daily at 16.30 h in the premises of Messe Erfurt, Erfurt.

For the each programme the following prizes are awarded
100 points gold medal with diploma and congratulations of the jury

99,99 – 90,00 points gold medal with diploma

89,99 – 80,00 points silver medal with diploma

79,99 – 70,00 points bronze medal with diploma

69,99 – 60,00 points diploma
